FROM THE

PASTOR

I have been invited to share with you about a mission that I have been involved in since its inception in 2012. I have mentioned it in a sermon. In 2012 a woman from Kenya had been visiting my church in Nashville. One Sunday, during prayers of the people I asked the congregation to turn to their neighbor and share a prayer request. My wife happened to be sitting next to our Kenyan visitor. She said, "You have to talk to our visitor Judy! She has an amazing vision to begin a school in Kenya."

Judy's father was a Anglican priest and had helped plant a church in a small village outside of Mombasa called Lower Bodoi. It was the first building outside of the huts. There were no good roads, no economy, no schools. Now there was a church. Judy's brother Joseph, who is now the executive director of this ministry, started bringing porridge on Saturdays. Word spread quickly and over a hundred kids gathered for this meagerest of meals. As they would wait until the meal was ready, Joseph would teach Bible stories. Judy was going to school in America and her only income was babysitting. Still, she would wire every spare dollar she had to help pay for the porridge.

I introduced Judy to our mission committee,

and they jumped in with both feet. We began by joining Judy to support the feeding ministry. Then, plans began to form to build a school and find teachers. We sent a team of 10 members to go to Kenya to see the village and meet the people. Once we raised enough money to build to school, we sent another team to witness the groundbreaking. Today the Angaza Nuru School serves over 300 children.

I am now the chair of Friends of Angaza Nuru which is a US 501C3 with the purpose of supporting the school and the ministry to the village at large. It costs \$75 to sponsor a child for a whole school year. That includes a uniform, materials, and 2 meals a day. We have 10 more children in need of sponsors. You can go to https://friendsofangazanuru.org/scholarship-form/ to sign up to be a sponsor. You will get a name, age, and picture of your child. My wife and I have been sponsoring the same child from the beginning. Or if you wish, you can drop off a check made payable to Friends of Angaza Nuru in the offering. We will get it to the them.

Anagaza Nuru means to illuminate. By joining us in this mission you will be helping to illuminate young minds, and hearts in the love of Christ and learning.

Safety Team Member Responsibilities

Two Safety Team members will be designated to perform certain duties in the sanctuary, commons area and church perimeter. These members will be listed in the bulletin insert and will wear safety team badges.

Sanctuary Team Member – This team member knows the locations of fire extinguishers, fire alarm pull boxes, first aid kits and the Automated External Defibrillator (AED). They are knowledgeable of escape routes and sheltering procedures in case evacuation is necessary. If a medical emergency occurs, they will assist medically trained personnel as directed and call 911 if necessary.

Commons/Perimeter Team Member – This team member will ensure the nursery is safe and will lock doors not used as primary entrances. All locked doors can still be opened from the inside. The safety checks include other areas such as the kitchen, classrooms and open closets. This member will remain in the commons area during the service and occasionally check the parking lot.

Special Event Checklist United Presbyterian Church

When preparing for a special event to occur on the UPC property, please be sure to:

Contact the administrative assistant to make sure there is no calendar conflict.
Send event information to the administrative assistant to be added to church communications in a timely manner.
If the event is open to the public, coordinate promotion as appropriate.
Notify the chair of the safety team to coordinate the safety needs of the event.
Identify someone to open and close the event. (Locks, lights, and alarm)
The sponsoring church group or member for the event will be responsible for setting up, breaking down, and cleaning up.
The sponsoring church group or member for the event is responsible for any necessary food and drink purchase, preparation, and clean up.
Coordinate any A/V needs with the Tech Team chair.
If you have any music needs, please contact the music coordinator.
If you have any receipts that require reimbursement, please fill out an Expense Voucher and turn it into the administrative assistant.
If this event involves fundraising, session approval is required first.
If the event is a non-church event whether from an outside group or members of the church, get a building usage form from the administrative assistant. It must be submitted and approved by the session, prior to scheduling the event.
If money is collected, then the money and the monies received form must be turned into the administrative assistant ASAP.

NOTES FROM THE OFFICE

OFFICE PROCEDURES:

Procedure for purchases or expense reimbursement

- 1. Member or staff person must obtain and complete an "Expense Voucher" and return it to the Administrative Assistant prior to purchase.
- 2. Administrative Assistant will review and confirm that enough money is in the appropriate budget category.
- 3. Administrative Assistant will make the purchase using church accounts thus saving sales tax and taking advantage of any church discounts.
- 4. If the purchase is going to be made by someone other than the Administrative Assistant that person should get the UPC tax number and present it to the seller to avoid paying sales tax.

EQUIPMENT AND FACILITY MANUALS:

Equipment checkout book (to keep track of equipment used/removed from UPC property)

Facility use manual (forms/information for parties, weddings or anniversaries etc.)


God is in control of your life and will give you the rest you need.
