A fellow pastor posted these words on Facebook that are very much worth considering:

"I fear that as long as the reason we invite people to our religious institutions is so they can fill our pews, take over our volunteer projects, and give us money, we're going to end up hurting the people who come to us looking for a connection to the Divine and authentic spiritual community.

Because it's deeply painful to want to be in relationship with someone, and to find out they really only want us to keep their institution going."

Over the years I have wondered why more church members don't invite people to church. Perhaps our motivation is in the wrong place, and we sense that, so we don't ask. If our rationale for inviting people to church is to find people to serve on committees, volunteer for various ministries, and support the budget, then we feel bad about asking. We know that we are asking of them more than we believe they will receive.

Think about the activities that you gladly and excitedly invite people to join you in: dinner parties, new restaurants, festivals, concerts—enjoyable things. And you want them to say yes, because you want to spend time

with them and share your enjoyment. We all hunger for authentic connection with others. We also all have a spiritual hunger, a desire to connect with the world beyond the one we see before us. People are looking for "connection to the Divine and authentic spiritual community." They want the real thing. Nothing fake or put on.

I believe that we have the real thing here at United Presbyterian Church. The ministry and the finances will happen. We have God with us and leading us. Let's focus on relationships.

I have a challenge for each of you: Find one person to invite into our spiritual community. Be their friend just to be their friend. Invite them into your life, which includes this church.

Start with this prayer: Lord, show me the person that you want me to be riend and invite to church.

Then become a spiritual friend. Ask them about their life. Pray for them. Invite them to join us for Sunday worship or some other event that you think they might enjoy. When they come to church, welcome them and sit with them. Or even pick them up, drive them to church, and have lunch with them afterwards.

Don't be afraid to make new friends. They may prove to be a bigger blessing to you than you can imagine!



#### Safety Team Member Responsibilities

Two Safety Team members will be designated to perform certain duties in the sanctuary, commons area and church perimeter. These members will be listed in the bulletin insert and will wear safety team badges.


Sanctuary Team Member – This team member knows the locations of fire extinguishers, fire alarm pull boxes, first aid kits and the Automated External Defibrillator (AED). They are knowledgeable of escape routes and sheltering procedures in case evacuation is necessary. If a medical emergency occurs, they will assist medically trained personnel as directed and call 911 if necessary.

Commons/Perimeter Team Member – This team member will ensure the nursery is safe and will lock doors not used as primary entrances. All locked doors can still be opened from the inside. The safety checks include other areas such as the kitchen, classrooms and open closets. This member will remain in the commons area during the service and occasionally check the parking lot.

# When preparing for a special event to occur on the UPC property, please be sure to:

Contact the administrative assistant to make sure there is no calendar conflict.
Send event information to the administrative assistant to be added to church communications in a timely manner.
If the event is open to the public, coordinate promotion as appropriate.
Notify the chair of the safety team to coordinate the safety needs of the event.
Identify someone to open and close the event. (Locks, lights, and alarm)
The sponsoring church group or member for the event will be responsible for setting up, breaking down, and cleaning up.
The sponsoring church group or member for the event is responsible for any necessary food and drink purchase, preparation, and clean up.

### NOTES FROM THE OFFICE

#### **OFFICE PROCEDURES:**

Procedure for purchases or expense reimbursement

- 1. Member or staff person must obtain and complete an "Expense Voucher" and return it to the Administrative Assistant prior to purchase.
- 2. Administrative Assistant will review and confirm that enough money is in the appropriate budget category.
- 3. Administrative Assistant will make the purchase using church accounts thus saving sales tax and taking advantage of any church discounts.
- 4. If the purchase is going to be made by someone other than the Administrative Assistant that person should get the UPC tax number and present it to the seller to avoid paying sales tax.

#### **EQUIPMENT AND FACILITY MANUALS:**

Equipment checkout book (to keep track of equipment used/removed from UPC property)

Facility use manual (forms/information for parties, weddings or anniversaries etc.)


