

My Dear Friends,

I want to thank you from the bottom of my heart for the love you have shown me in the period that I have been with you. You reminded me of how much I love being a pastor. As you prepare for your new pastor, I want to suggest a few things for his sake and for yours.

- Lean into God. It is the instinct of churches to lean into their pastors, who do represent God's presence in some ways.
 However, we are not God. As you transition remind yourself that the Lord is your shepherd (same word as pastor!).
 Rely on God above all people and things.
- 2) Let me go. It is good to be glad for my time with you. I am very glad for it. I loved my time with you. So give me a good farewell, but say goodbye. Forgive me for leaving if that feels necessary. Wash your hands of me and shake off the dust. Haha. The better you let go of me the more open for Rev. O'Neil you will be. Holding on to me will only limit Rev. O'Neil's ministry.
- 3) Love Mike O'Neil. Mike will be at his best when with your love and support. You may feel the urge to guard the church from pastors and their wild ideas. Just love him. That doesn't mean you have to agree with everything he says. When pastors feel like the church is against them then they will not be successful and therefore the church will not have success. Just love him. He will be at his best and so will you.

Lastly, I want to tell you three gifts that you gave me in my time with you.

1) You reminded me that God called me to be a pastor. At the end of 2019, I felt called to leave pastoral ministry for a time

- to develop and learn to practice the theory I developed in my dissertation. I am glad I did. But saying yes to being the interim pastor at Greenville was one of the best decisions I ever made. It has prepared me for my next call as a pastor.
- 2) You brought out my best preaching. I have never felt freer in the pulpit and more connected to God as I preached. I never worried about criticism or the need to perform or impress. I think that is because you accepted me so lovingly.
- 3) You showed me the best way to do a Bible study. One of the highlights of my time here has been co-teaching through the Gospel of Matthew with Pat Penland. I have taught through many of the books of the Bible over the years, but there was something special about this one. There is something so very Presbyterian about the partnership between a minister, an elder, and God's people. The Spirit was very present and apparent in that study, even more so than in the preaching. I am convinced that a Bible study that allows for conversation is the best form of discipleship a church can have. There is one thing that would perfect it. If every week there was a mission that everyone was sent out to do during the week. That's what Jesus did with the disciples. Practice makes perfect.

Of course, the greatest gift you gave me is your love. I will cherish you and your love for me always. Thank you! You have made me a better pastor and a better man of God because of your love. Your love is your greatest and most valuable strength as a congregation. If you love everyone you meet like you have loved me then this church can't fail. Just don't forget to invite them to church so they can get the full effect of God's love. Love is how you will grow as individuals and as a church.

***honorariums for loved ones who have battled cancer



Safety Team Member Responsibilities

Two Safety Team members will be designated to perform certain duties in the sanctuary, commons area and church perimeter. These members will be listed in the bulletin insert and will wear safety team badges.

Sanctuary Team Member – This team member knows the locations of fire extinguishers, fire alarm pull boxes, first aid kits and the Automated External Defibrillator (AED). They are knowledgeable of escape routes and sheltering procedures in case evacuation is necessary. If a medical emergency occurs, they will assist medically trained personnel as directed and call 911 if necessary.

Commons/Perimeter Team Member – This team member will ensure the nursery is safe and will lock doors not used as primary entrances. All locked doors can still be opened from the inside. The safety checks include other areas such as the kitchen, classrooms and open closets. This member will remain in the commons area during the service and occasionally check the parking lot.



When preparing for a special event to occur on the UPC property, please be sure to:

Contact the administrative assistant to make sure there is no calendar conflict.
Send event information to the administrative assistant to be added to church communications in a timely manner.
If the event is open to the public, coordinate promotion as appropriate.
Notify the chair of the safety team to coordinate the safety needs of the event.
Identify someone to open and close the event. (Locks, lights, and alarm)
The sponsoring church group or member for the event will be responsible for setting up, breaking down, and cleaning up.
The sponsoring church group or member for the event is responsible for any necessary food and drink purchase, preparation, and clean up.

NOTES FROM THE OFFICE

OFFICE PROCEDURES:

Procedure for purchases or expense reimbursement

- 1. Member or staff person must obtain and complete an "Expense Voucher" and return it to the Administrative Assistant prior to purchase.
- 2. Administrative Assistant will review and confirm that enough money is in the appropriate budget category.
- 3. Administrative Assistant will make the purchase using church accounts thus saving sales tax and taking advantage of any church discounts.
- 4. If the purchase is going to be made by someone other than the Administrative Assistant that person should get the UPC tax number and present it to the seller to avoid paying sales tax.

"For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit."


Romans 16:17
