I wanted to briefly talk about how we care for one another in this congregation. I don't mean being nice to one another or not having conflict in the church. I mean congregational care, member support for those among who may be in need of expressions of the church's love and support. I want to start with a couple of practical items for consideration.

A WORD

If you are hospitalized and would like a visit from someone in the church please let me, the church or someone else know. The days are long gone when I could go to the hospital and get the Presbyterian list. HIPPA has changed how I can get the information so please let us know.

I take your medical confidentiality seriously. I do not share your medical information with anyone without your permission, that includes the office and my wife Christine. It doesn't happen often but sometimes there is a request that a situation go no further than me. So please be explicit with me or others who you ask to pray for you if it can be public knowledge (like the Sunday prayer list) or remain strictly confidential. Sometimes I am out of the loop and that is ok. Please let me know of a member's need if you have permission, sometimes I already know but have been asked not to share but it is better to tell me than assume I know what is going on with a member or friend of the church.

I believe that pastoral care or caring for members is a ministry and calling of the church rather than just the work of the pastor. We have 3 care groups that are charged with supporting and praying for members of our congregation. If you do not know who is in charge of our care group, please call the office. It is good for members to visit, call, pray for and send cards to our members who are hurting, shut in, or just need a word of encouragement. Help me help our members know they are loved and not forgotten by their church.

I am still getting to know our members but if you are someone who might be considered a shut-in or might need home communion occasionally during the year, please let me know and I will make a point to reach out. I know some people wouldn't want the pastor to come visit and others expect it please let me know your preference.

If you need to talk, or have an appointment at the church, or simply need me to pray with and for you please let me know.

This is slightly off topic but throughout my ministry I have discovered that people have different ways they prefer to be contacted (phone, email, or text) please let me know what works best for you. I will often check in with a member without making an in person visit.



Safety Team Member Responsibilities

Two Safety Team members will be designated to perform certain duties in the sanctuary, commons area and church perimeter. These members will be listed in the bulletin insert and will wear safety team badges.

Sanctuary Team Member – This team member knows the locations of fire extinguishers, fire alarm pull boxes, first aid kits and the Automated External Defibrillator (AED). They are knowledgeable of escape routes and sheltering procedures in case evacuation is necessary. If a medical emergency occurs, they will assist medically trained personnel as directed and call 911 if necessary.

Commons/Perimeter Team Member – This team member will ensure the nursery is safe and will lock doors not used as primary entrances. All locked doors can still be opened from the inside. The safety checks include other areas such as the kitchen, classrooms and open closets. This member will remain in the commons area during the service and occasionally check the parking lot.




Upper Room Devotional Books


Walk With the Spirit




